Archiving for the Future - Round Table

The purpose of this **roundtable** is to reflect on the possibilities of archiving in the performing arts, especially theatre and dance. This contains challenges due to the fact that we work on the transmission of a living and ephemeral heritage linked to the human body. In addition, new technological realities are part of a social domain where we witness an increase in digital literacy, a change in power relations between generations, but also the increase in inequality between human communities, which tends to strengthen in the future. With this roundtable we aim to gain a broader perspective on how to create synergies between new technologies and the domain of performing art archives on national and European levels.

Through the presentation of examples from participating experts and informal interactive group sessions, we aim to collectively articulate possible answers to the question:

How can we prepare a future where the archive contributes to enhance human goals linked to creativity and to the dissolution of personal and socio-geographical limitations that block access to learning and to culture?

In addition to the debate on the state of the art, we will present the Premiere Project work on dance and theater archive browsing enhanced with AI semantic analysis and VR. In dialogue with the participants as potential users, we aim to get to know their perceptions, ideas and desires regarding its archive enhancement proposal.

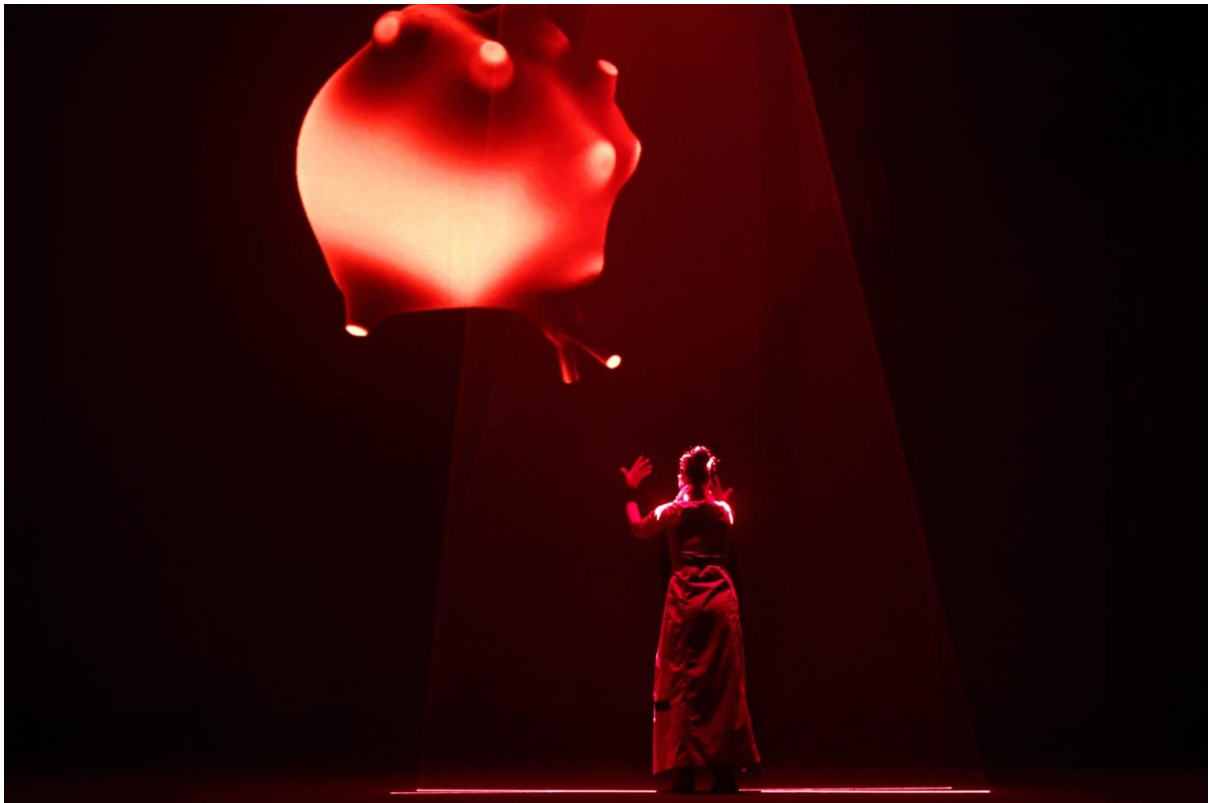

FRA

Onder de noemer *FRA* (Italiaans voor 'tussen') organiseert ICK vanaf 2013 bijeenkomsten waar het intuïtieve lichaam ter discussie wordt gesteld door provocatie en tegenspraak. Tot nu toe altijd nomadisch maar vanaf 2022 met regelmaat op de nieuwe plek van ICK: *Space for Dance Art*. Uiteenlopende kennisgebieden en disciplines worden uitgenodigd om hun licht te schijnen op de kracht en kwetsbaarheid van het lichaam. De bijeenkomsten zijn voor een breed publiek die geïnteresseerd zijn in dans, in beweging of gewoonweg in de fictie van het lichaam.

Deze editie van FRA vindt plaats in het kader van de [PREMIERE EU-project Open Dagen](#) in Amsterdam 19-21 september. Met uitgenodigde sprekers, het PREMIERE consortium en het publiek willen wij een kritische dialoog tussen artistieke praktijken en de technologische sector initiëren. Welke creatieve en ethische dimensies komen tervoorschijn als wij het intuïtieve lichaam in relatie tot de nieuwste ontwikkelingen in AI-technologieën positioneren?

FRA

Under the name FRA (Italian for 'in between'), ICK has been organizing meetings since 2013 where the intuitive body is questioned through provocation and contradiction. Until now, these meetings have been nomadic but from 2022 onwards they will occur regularly at the new home of ICK: *Space for Dance Art*. The meetings are for a wide audience interested in dance, in movement or simply in the fiction of the body.

This edition of FRA takes place in the context of the [PREMIERE EU project Open Days](#) in Amsterdam 19-21 September. Together with invited speakers, the PREMIERE consortium and the audience, we aim to ignite a creative dialogue between artistic practices and the technological sector. Which creative and ethical dimensions come to the fore when positioning the intuitive body in relation to latest developments in AI technologies?

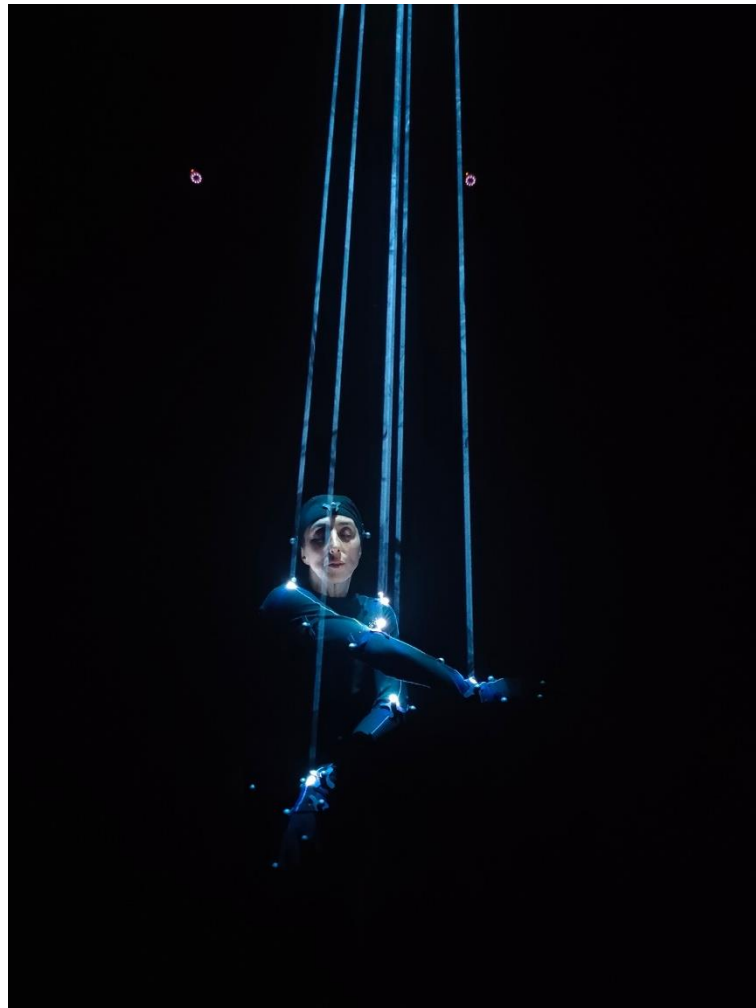

Instituto Stocos Workshop

In this trans-disciplinary workshop we will work on some principles that are common to the arts of movement, music, and the visual arts. We will seek a cross-fertilization between these disciplines by employing interactive digital systems. We will analyze in a practical way how this study can contribute to the development of choreography, electroacoustic composition and the generation of images in real time. We will experiment with several techniques for the design of digital instruments of this type capable of expanding the expressiveness of body movement to other sensory modalities such as acoustics and visual imagery. These techniques include computerized analysis methods and the sonification of qualities of movement, models of embodied cognition, and generative algorithms from the field of artificial intelligence. Not only will we experience how these multi-modal instruments can be a valuable tool for generating immersive environments in a scenic context, but also the use of this interactive technology as a means to amplify body awareness and the limits of one's own physicality.

For:

Dancers / Choreographers: experience in contemporary dance, interest in interactive control of media.

Musicians/ Composers: experience with sound synthesis and open sound control (familiarity with SuperCollider a benefit but not requirement).

Creative coders: familiarity with creative coding platform such as processing or openframeworks, interest in machine learning, interest in dance and technology.
